Anyone who wants to participate in the Canada Cup and who is on the official ranking (cumulative points), can enter even if they are not qualified. If a place is available, the next in the ranking who made entries, will have the place.

Regulations:

- 1. In the event of injury to a horse qualified for the Canada Cup, this horse will automatically be replaced by the next position in the cumulative qualifications.
- 2. A maximum of 7 qualifications per competitor can be made in the case of riders and jumpers. During rodeos, the jumper can pass a maximum of 5 times per show.
- 3. The start is in the arena. It is forbidden to start your race in the alleyway.
- 4. If a registered participant does not show up at the rodeo and has not notified the secretary at the time of callbacks, a fine equivalent to the amount of entries will be charged at the next rodeo. We only accept veterinary and/or doctor's evidence as supporting documentation.
- 5. If a horse is injured during the competition and the owner has to leave the competition premises for a medical reason, the other horsees belonging to the same owner will be able to accumulate their 10 participation points for the weekend.
- 6. Following the callbacks, a maximum of 1 change will be tolerated for the team up to one hour before the start of the rodeo, otherwise the change will not be accepted and a fine will be payable.

Regulations:

- 1. Each horse in the team accumulates its own points (see scoring below).
- 2. Standings for each horse.
- 3. At the end of the summer, the first **9** horses in the standings will be able to choose a horse that has qualified to form their team.
- 4. The rider can qualify up to a maximum of 3 times.
- 5. The horse can only qualify once.
- 6. In the event of injury to a horse qualified for the Canada Cup, this horse will automatically be replaced by the next position in the standings.

Regulations:

Riders must have participated in one of the youth barrel competitions listed in the competition locations section. On each weekend, riders can qualify for the right to enter St-Tite (depending on the results of the competitions). If a rider is already qualified in the 1st positions of the go, we take the following positions. The rider can register a single mount at St-Tite. When the rider is qualified, we go directly to the next position. During registration, **the rider can register with the mount of their choice**. If the rider is injured, we move on to the next person.

Online registration, the date is to be determined. Check the information during the summer on the website of the Festival Western St-Tite at: <u>www.festivalwestern.com</u>. All participants will pass in the slack, with the 8 best times passing on the Final on Sunday at 4:30pm.

Anyone who has made an entry and who does not show up for the competitions, must pay the registration fees for the class or classes concerned. Only medical proof can cancel these costs.

How Points Work:

At each qualifying weekend, competitors accumulate points according to the following system:

1. Participation points will be awarded for each weekend of competition. Eg. 10 points per participation per weekend.

How Rodeo Work and Breakdown by Class:

For the finals on Sunday, 4:30pm:

- 1. In all rodeo classes, we take the top 8 in the average.
- 2. In the pickup and exchange, we take the 8 best times of the 2 goes
- 3. In the **poney express**, we take the 6 **best times** of the 2 goes

There will be 2 goes for all disciplines except in the youth barrel racing class.

Important The points earned at the Canada Cup Finals count towards the current year's IPRA standings.
